Who are Friends of Craig Brook NFH?

The Friends of Craig Brook NFH is a non-profit organization established in 1995 to support the mission of the Craig Brook National Fish Hatchery in recovering the endangered Atlantic Salmon and their habitat in Maine's rivers.

The mission of the Friends of Craig Brook shall be to undertake educational and other activities both independently and cooperatively with Craig Brook National Fish Hatchery operated by the United States Fish & Wildlife Service.

Activities undertaken by the Friends of Craig Brook are aimed at maintaining and enhancing Atlantic Salmon resources and promoting responsible stewardship of related watersheds and ecosystems. All activities will benefit the fish, wildlife and habitat resources, and the people of Maine and elsewhere through increased information and outreach.

What do the Friends of Craig Brook do?

The Friends of Craig Brook works in partnership with the US Fish & Wildlife Service's Craig Brook National Fish Hatchery through a memorandum agreement, as well as with special interest groups (salmon clubs, etc.) and local communities to:

- Promote understanding of CBNFH's mission through special projects in interpretation, education and outreach by offering volunteer support
- Protect river resources that cannot be protected by the US Fish & Wildlife Service alone.
- Involve citizens in Salmon management activities.
- Foster cooperative and mutually productive relationships between CBNFH, local communities, schools and special interest groups.
- Provide fund raising support for special projects, environmental education initiatives, and transformation of an historic Hatchery building into the nation's only Atlantic Salmon museum where visitors can learn about Atlantic Salmon and fishing, past, present and future.
- Provide staffing for the CBNFH Visitor Center.
- Assist the CBNFH staff with various tasks throughout the year in the production of Salmon brood stock.
